Very Little Wear (MW)	0.07-- 0.15	Minor blemishes or scratches, frequently only obvious on close assessment.
Field-Tested (FT)	0.15-- 0.38	Noticeable wear, scratches, and fading. This is the most common condition.
Well-Worn (WW)	0.38-- 0.45	Substantial wear. Parts of the paint might look chipped or greatly faded.
Battle-Scarred (BS)	0.45-- 1.00	Severe wear. The weapon looks heavily rusted, beaten, or almost removed of paint.

Keep in mind: Some skins are "capped," indicating they can not drop in Factory New condition, while others in fact look much better with greater wear (referred to as "Blackimovs" on specific AWP models).

2. Rarity Tiers and Drop Rates

Skins are color-coded based upon their rarity. This rarity dictates how challenging the product is to acquire through random drops or by opening weapon cases with keys.

- **Customer Grade (White):** Common, basic drops.
- **Industrial Grade (Light Blue):** Slightly much better than Consumer Grade.
- **Mil-Spec (Blue):** Standard quality for most collection drops and low-tier case items.
- **Limited (Purple):** Uncommon; typically used as trade-up fodder.
- **Classified (Pink):** Rare, extremely desired weapon surfaces.
- **Covert (Red):** The highest standard rarity found in cases, including iconic designs like the AWP|Asiimov or M4A4|Howl.
- **Extremely Rare (★ Gold):** Special items, including Knives and Gloves.

Approximate Case Odds

Opening cases is a form of gambling, and the chances greatly favor your home. According to neighborhood research study and Valve's main disclosures in certain regions, **CSGO Skins** the rough likelihoods of unboxing products are:

- **Mil-Spec (Blue):** ~ 79.92%
- **Restricted (Purple):** ~ 15.98%
- **Classified (Pink):** ~ 3.20%
- **Covert (Red):** ~ 0.64%
- **Special Item (★ Gold/Knife/Gloves):** ~ 0.26%

3. **Pattern Templates:** Certain skins utilize a randomized pattern index (0 to 999).
 - *Case Hardened* skins, for example, can have an enormous quantity of "blue gem" protection, driving their rates into 10s of thousands of dollars.
 - *Fade* portions determine just how much of the rainbow gradient shows up on the gun.
4. **Sticker labels and Souvenirs:** Applying expert tournament stickers can often add worth, especially if they are unusual autographs or from ceased Major champions.

4. How to Acquire CS: GO Skins
