

How Much Does Garage door repair Cost in Los Angeles?

In Los Angeles, the average garage door repair cost is often between \$150 and \$650, depending on the damaged component, door size, accessibility, and urgency. Minor adjustments, lubrication, or track alignment may cost about \$100 to \$250, while a broken spring, damaged garage door panel, or failed automatic garage door opener can require a greater investment.

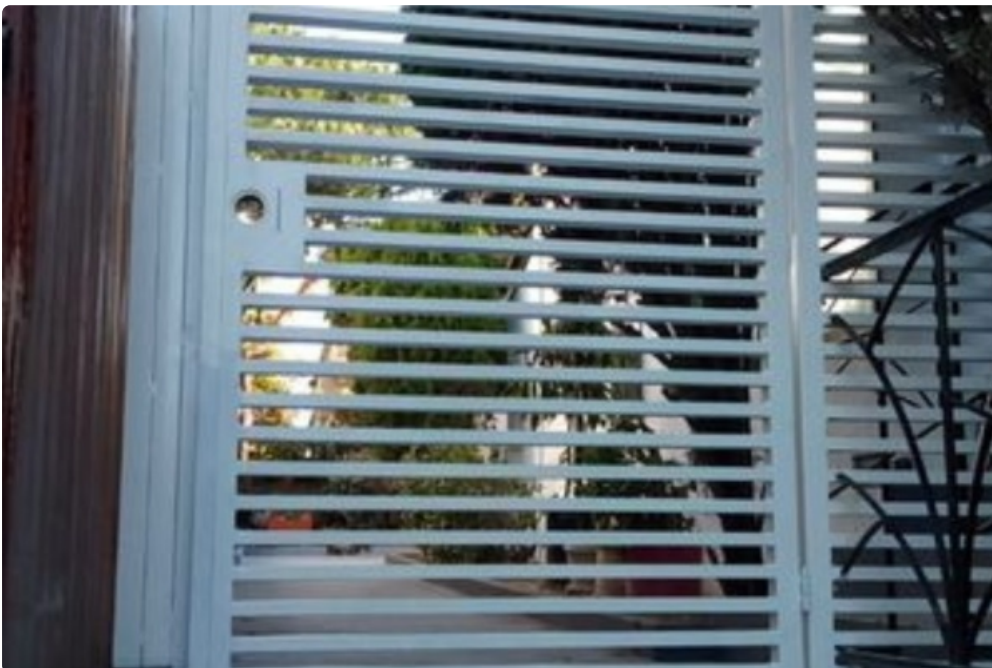
