4. Jackpot

In a Jackpot game, numerous gamers toss skins into a central pot. Each skin adds to the player's general percentage chance of winning the entire pot (based on the dollar value of their contribution). A virtual spinner chooses a winning ticket, and one lucky gamer takes home all the transferred skins.
