

Millsboro has a way of surprising people. On paper, it is a small Sussex County town with a steady rhythm, rooted in local history and shaped by the inland waterways and roads that connect southern Delaware. Spend any amount of time here, though, and the town reveals more texture than its size suggests. There are older buildings that still carry the weather of decades, neighborhoods where curb appeal matters because people know their neighbors, and commercial strips that have to hold up under salt air, pollen, and the kind of summer humidity that leaves a film on just about everything.
