The Mechanics: How Transactions Work

1. Deposits

- **Minor Gambling:** Because registration typically just needs a Steam account connected by means of OpenID, minors can sometimes bypass age confirmation checks, exposing young gamers to prospective gambling addiction.
- **Rip-off Sites:** Fake or deceitful clone sites regularly pop up, imitating popular platforms exclusively to steal user stocks by means of deceptive Steam API phishing links.

Best Practices for Navigating the Space
