Rates fluctuate based upon supply, need, and market trends on the Steam Community Market (SCM).

How Case Opening Works

1. **Acquire a Case and a Key**-- Cases can be made through gameplay (dropped after matches) or bought from the SCM. Keys are purchased from the in-game store or from third-party marketplaces.
2. **Open the Inventory Menu**-- Navigate to the "Cases" tab in the inventory screen.

Do's and Do n'ts

- **Do** set a strict spending plan before opening cases. Choose ahead of time just how much you're willing to spend and never ever exceed it.
- **Do** keep the skins you like for personal use instead of focusing entirely on resale.
- **Do** monitor market trends; particular skins spike in worth throughout competitions or after brand-new case releases.
- **Do not** chase losses by acquiring more keys in hopes of "winning back" money.
- **Don't** treat case opening as an investment technique; the chances are not in your favour.

Tips for Maximising Value

- **Buy cases when they're cheap**-- Newer cases tend to be low-cost at launch, then increase as the supply diminishes.
- **Use trade-up agreements**-- By combining lower-tier skins, you can potentially obtain a higher-tier skin at a decreased expense.
- **Sell instantly after opening**-- If you're not preparing to use the skin, listing it on the SCM right away can lock in existing market prices before they dip.

Where to Buy, Sell, and Trade

- **Steam Community Market**-- The main platform for purchasing and offering skins. It uses secure deals however enforces a 15% charge on earnings.
- **Third-Party Marketplaces**-- Sites like Buff.163, Skinport, or DMarket typically supply lower fees and faster liquidity, however verify the platform's track record to prevent frauds.
- **Trade-Up Sites**-- Some neighborhoods host "trade-up" services where you can exchange numerous products for an opportunity at a rarer skin, typically for a service fee.

1. How much does it cost to open a CS2 case?
