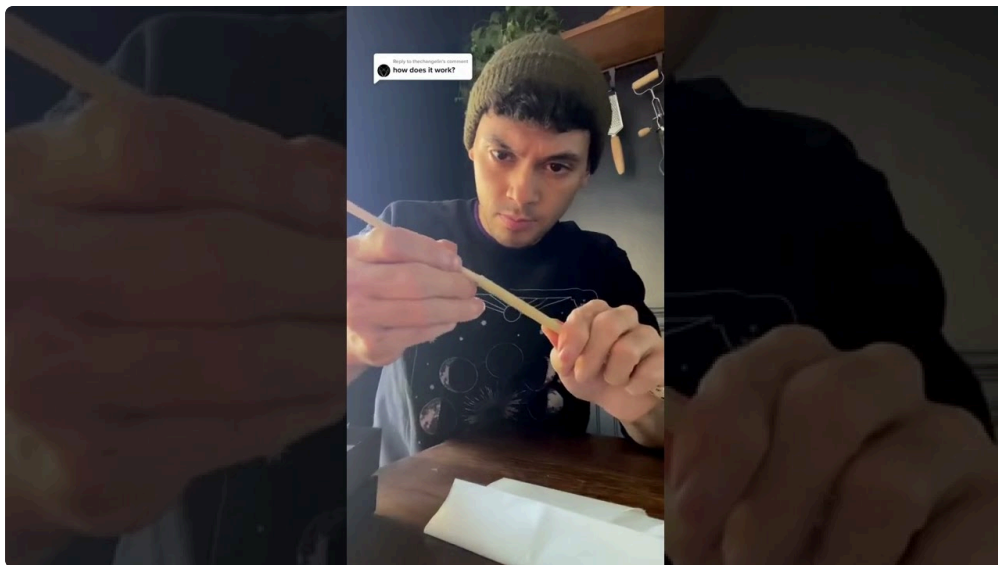
Practical shooting setups I've had luck with
