Common Game Modes

- **Prize:** Multiple players deposit skins into a single pot. The greater the worth of a gamer's deposit, the greater their statistical possibility of winning the whole built up pot.
- **Esports Betting:** Wagering on professional CS2 matches (e.g., ESL Pro League, Majors) using virtual balance or skins, forecasting match winners, map ratings, or specific in-game occasions.
