All of these platforms need you to connect a Steam account and deposit skins or funds (often by means of crypto, credit card, or payment services such as PayPal). Once the battle concludes, payouts are credited quickly, and you can withdraw skins to your Steam stock or transform them to cash on the website's marketplace.



## How to Start a Case Battle in 5 Simple Steps

1. **Produce an Account**-- Register on your chosen platform and validate your Steam profile.
2. **Deposit Funds**-- Transfer skins through the platform's deposit system or buy credit directly.
3. **Select a Battle Type**-- Choose between a quick 1v1, a custom battle, or a multi-player lobby.
4. **Set the Stake**-- Decide the entry cost (in skins or financial value) and verify the case list.
5. **Release the Battle**-- Click "Start" and watch the RNG choose the result.

After the battle concludes, the platform instantly disperses the prize to the winner's balance. If you lose, the stake is deducted and contributed to the winner's pot, minus the house edge.

- **Know the Expected Value (EV)**-- Each case has a published drop rate and average worth. Prevent cases with a really low EV unless you are going after an unusual skin.
