These permits typically need to be requested through the DC Department of Transportation several business days before the scheduled move date, so early planning matters.

Many downtown buildings have limited or no dedicated loading zones, which means trucks often rely on metered spaces or curbside parking that requires a permit to occupy legally. Checking with your building management about designated loading areas ahead of time can save significant time on moving day.
