Aspects That Influence Rarity

1. **Drop Rate**-- The likelihood of a case looking like a random drop is very low for some older cases. For example, the Operation Bravo Case drops are approximately 0.15% compared with 1-- 2% for contemporary cases.
2. **Occasion Duration**-- Cases tied to limited-time operations (e.g., Bravo, Shattered Web) cease to be awarded as soon as the operation ends. This produces a tough supply ceiling.

How Collectors Acquire Rare Cases

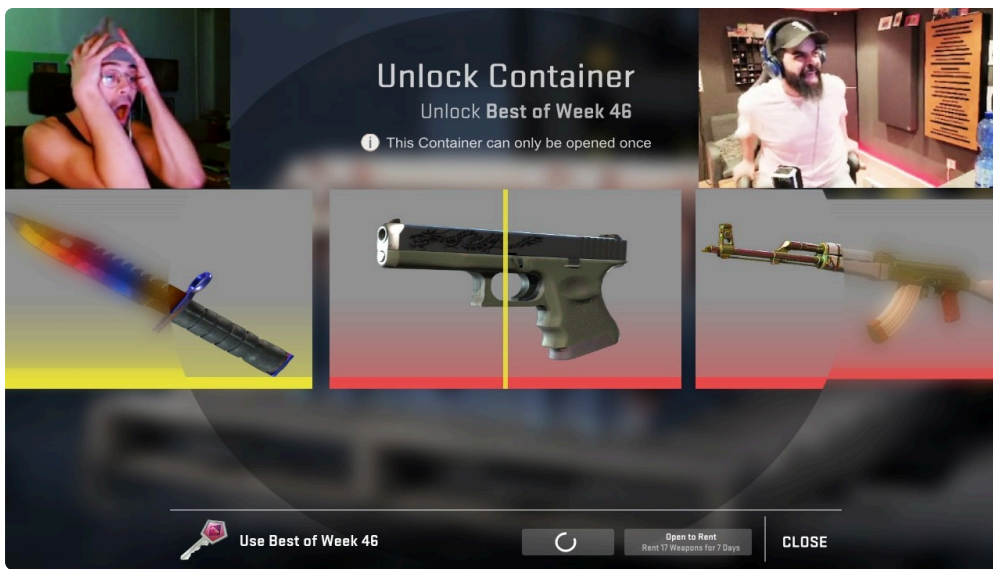
- **Steam Marketplace:** The main location for buying cases outright. Rates are set by sellers; market fees use.
- **Third-Party Trading Sites:** Platforms such as CSGOSkins.gg, Skinbay, or Buff.163 typically list cases at somewhat lower commissions, but validate seller credibility.
- **Neighborhood Giveaways & Events:** Occasionally, Valve or community influencers host free gifts where older cases are granted. Taking part in main CS: GO tournaments can also yield tradition case drops.
- **Bundle Purchase:** Some collectors purchase "secret boxes" that may consist of older cases; however, this technique is dangerous and often not cost-effective.

5. Will Valve ever re-release ceased cases? Valve has a history of sometimes reviving older operation cases in "re-operated" events (e.g., the return

of the Shattered Web operation). However, there's no official warranty that any particular case will be re-released.

6. How do I store a big collection of rare cases? CS: GO's in-game inventory is limited to 1,000 items. To handle a larger collection, think about utilizing Steam's "Inventory" filters to identify rare cases, or keep a separate

spreadsheet tracking external storage (e.g., a different Steam account or a third-party inventory supervisor).
