1. Verify Game File Integrity

- Ensure **Reflex Low Latency** is set to "Enabled + Boost" instead of triggering disputes with your particular CPU.

4. Manage Overlays and Background Applications

Overlays are well-known for causing hook conflicts with the Source 2 engine. Consider disabling:

- Discord Overlay
- Steam Overlay (Right-click CS2 in Steam > > Properties > > General > Enable the Steam Overlay while in-game -> >
- Toggle OFF)NVIDIA GeForce Experience Shadowplay/ In-Game Overlay
- Third-party overclocking and tracking software application like MSI Afterburner or RivaTuner Statistics Server (RTSS).
