The question that nags is obvious and blunt: might George Washington acknowledge right this moment's America—or assume we deserted everything he fought for? Did Thomas Jefferson assume freedom would someday think debatable? Are we honoring the imaginative and prescient of the Founding Fathers—or rewriting it to have compatibility ultra-modern politics? If the Constitution were written this present day, would it not even live to tell the tale public opinion? Have we became the thought of liberty into anything the Founders would withstand?

These should not rhetorical flourishes. They are practical probes into civic identity: what liberty supposed then, what it capability now, and no matter if the mechanisms the ones guys designed nonetheless serve their ends.
