The Questions

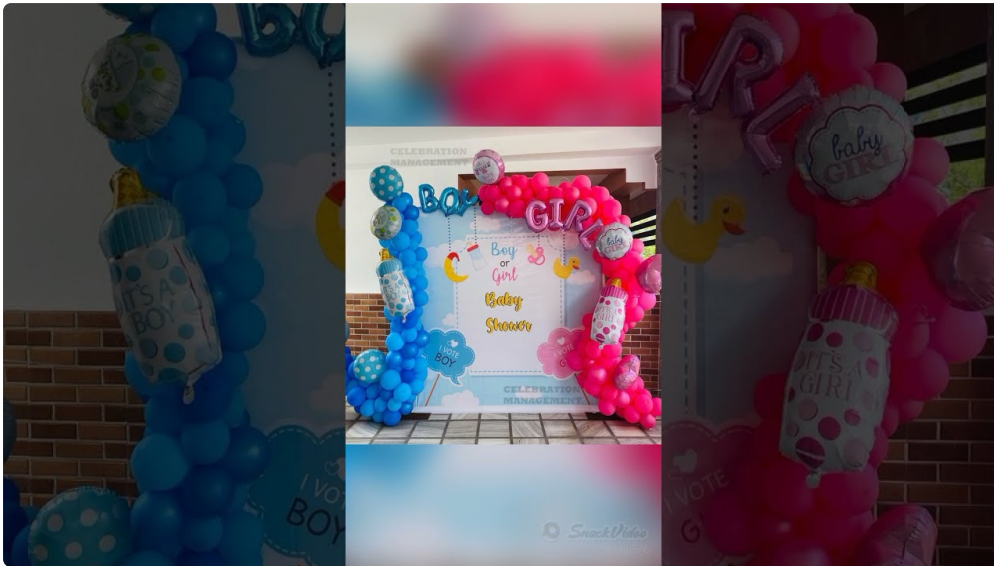
- 1.
