3. Prime Status Benefits

As discussed, having Prime Status is non-negotiable for major gamers seeking to make complimentary items. Prime gamers are matched with other Prime users (lowering cheater encounters) and are exclusively eligible for weekly care plans that consist of valuable weapon cases and random skin drops.

4. Major Tournaments and View Passes

During Valve-sponsored CS2 Major championships, viewers can buy or in some cases make Souvenir Packages.

- By watching the competition live by means of the Steam TV or in-game customer, or by taking part in the Pick 'Em Challenge utilizing a Viewer Pass, gamers can earn Souvenir Cases particular to that tournament.
- These cases do not need a key to open, making them 100% free worth once obtained.

Alternative Methods: External Sites (Proceed with Caution)

Many third-party websites market "totally free CS: GO cases" through sign-up rewards, discount codes, or day-to-day rewards. While a few of these platforms are legitimate community-trusted trading or gambling sites, players should exercise extreme care.

- **The Smart Choice (Selling):** For a lot of gamers, offering active-pool cases instantly on the Steam Community Market is the best method to build up a wallet balance.
