| <b>Minimal Wear (MW)</b>   | 0.07--      | 0.15  | Really light wear, typically little scratches noticeable just upon close inspection. |
| <b>Field-Tested (FT)</b>   | 0.15--      | 0.38  | Noticeable wear and tear, scratches on the body and paint cracking on edges.         |
| <b>Well-Worn (WW)</b>      | 0.38--      | 0.45  | Significant wear, heavy scratching, and visible fading of colors.                    |
| <b>Battle-Scarred (BS)</b> | 0.45--      | 1.00  | Exceptionally used, greatly faded, rusted, or scraped look.                          |

Keep in mind: Some skins are "capped," suggesting they can not physically drop in Factory New condition because of how the texture is set.
