A "Provably Fair" system utilizes cryptography to prove that the outcome of a case battle was predetermined and could not be changed by the website operator *after* you placed your bet. You can confirm the fairness of each round using the provided server seeds and client seeds.

5. Can I get VAC banned for using case field of honor?

Utilizing third-party trading and case-opening sites does not directly result in a Valve Anti-Cheat (VAC) ban. Nevertheless, Valve occasionally updates its terms of service or prohibits API secrets associated with automatic trading bots, which can briefly disrupt your ability to trade skins.
