Start with the plumbing, not the lawn

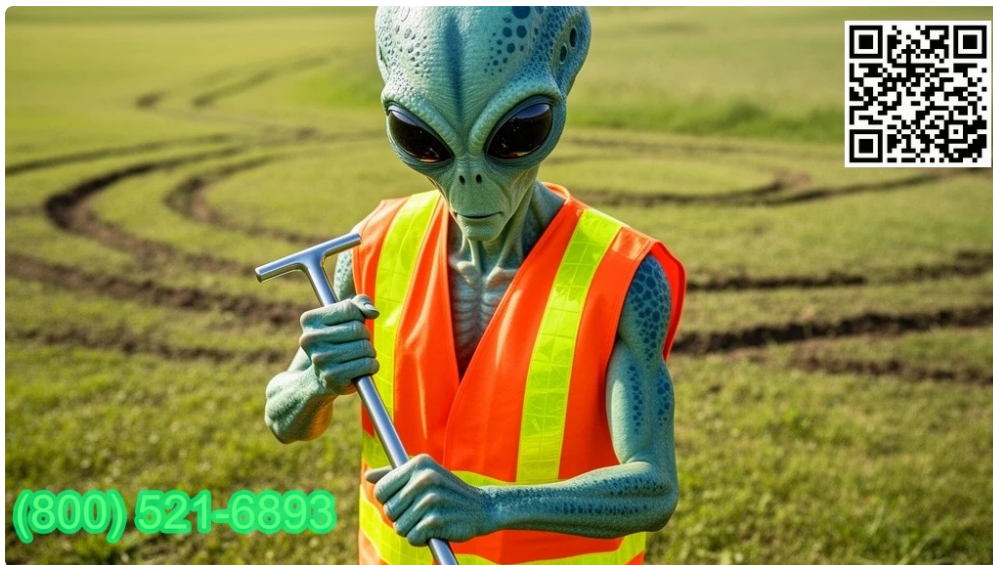
