- **Prioritize Reputable Sites:** Never use an unproven platform. Adhere to widely known sites with positive community evaluations, transparent provably reasonable systems, and safe withdrawal processes.

Safety and Security: What to Watch Out For

Since CS case field of honor run separately of Valve, security is vital. Before linking your Steam account or depositing funds, always keep the following safety practices in mind:

- **Beware of Phishing Scams:** Double-check URLs. Fraudsters often produce lookalike sites to take login qualifications and Steam API secrets.
- **Check for "Provably Fair" Systems:** Reputable platforms use cryptographic algorithms that allow players to confirm that the result of every case opening was really random and established.
