Step 2: Label Boxes by Room

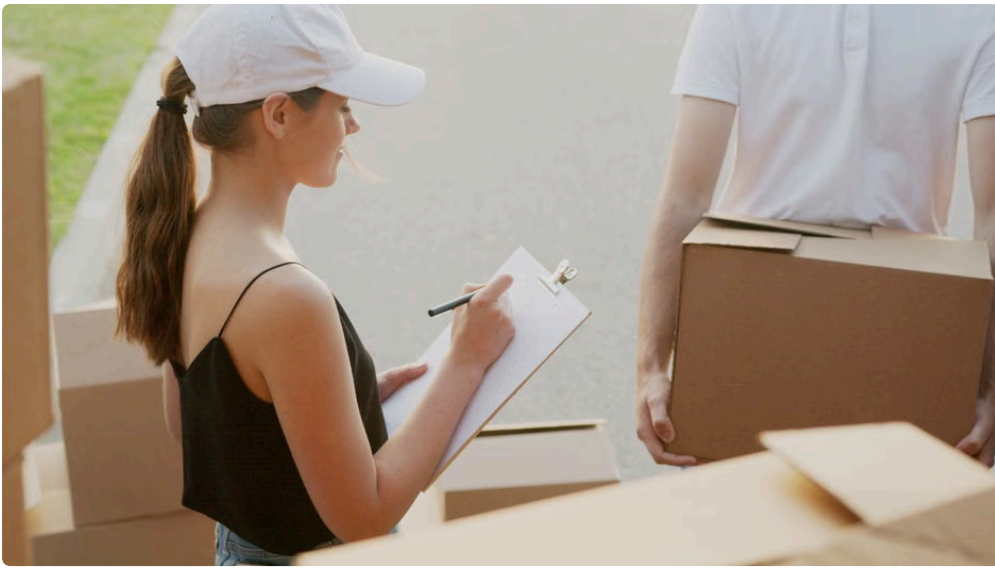
One of my biggest pet peeves is when families or moving crews skip labeling boxes properly. Labeling boxes by room explicitly—like "Kitchen," "Master Bedroom," or "Kids' Playroom"—saves so much time during unloading and unpacking. It also helps movers know exactly where to place boxes inside your new home.

Tips for Labeling Boxes Effectively

- Use bold, waterproof markers to write the room name on multiple sides of each box.
- Add a short inventory note on what's inside each box, like "books" or "dishes."
- Color-code labels by room (e.g., blue for bedrooms, green for kitchen) for quick visual sorting.

Step 3: Pack an Essentials Box

Moving can be chaotic, and access to your everyday essentials may be limited for some hours or even a day. Pack a designated essentials box that follows your family through the day and beyond the move.



What to Include in Your Essentials Box

- Personal items: toiletries, medications, and basic first aid supplies
- Chargers and electronics
- Change of clothes for each family member
- Basic kitchen supplies: snacks, paper plates, napkins, and utensils
- Important documents: moving contract, IDs, and keys

This box should stay with you during transit and be one of the first things unloaded in your new home.

Step 4: Protecting Your Belongings and Home

During the move, protecting both your possessions and the physical home is critical.

Tips for Keeping Your Belongings Safe

- **Wrap fragile items carefully:** Use bubble wrap, moving blankets, or towels to prevent damage.
- **Disassemble furniture:** Take apart beds, tables, and other large items to avoid scratches or breaks.
