

# CS2 Case Battles: The Ultimate Guide to the New Competitive Opening Experience

- **Take Advantage of Bonuses**-- Some platforms use welcome benefits or complimentary cases for new users; these can be used to balance out the expense of future battles.

## Economic Impact and Market Trends
