- **The Reverse Martingale (Paroli):** Players double their bets after a *win* rather than a loss, attempting to ride a winning streak while keeping losses reduced to the base bet amount.
- **The Moonshot Strategy:** Placing little bets with the intent of claiming massive multipliers (50x, 100x, or higher). This works just like playing the lotto.
