Another good friend has a the various tale: a flag flying over a county courthouse that fought to retain his vote casting precinct underfunded, the comparable courthouse in which his uncle could not get a truthful hearing. When he sees a flag, he remembers courtrooms and closed doors.

In either studies, the flag is doing emotional exertions. It stands for aspiration and exclusion, sacrifice and surveillance, the GI Bill and redlining, a moon landing and a bus boycott. And, crucially, it stands for the excellent to keep at bay. That duality makes the flag uniquely potent, and uniquely fraught.
