1. Use Ratings (Float Value)

Condition Drift Range Visual Description **Factory New (FN)** 0.00-- 0.07 Pristine, minimal to no scratches.

Minimal Wear (MW) 0.07-- 0.15 Minor blemishes or minor scratches. **Field-Tested (FT)** 0.15-- 0.38 Visible wear, scratches, and fading. **Well-Worn (WW)** 0.38-- 0.44 Substantial wear; paint is visibly chipped. **Battle-Scarred (BS)** 0.44-- 1.00 Greatly worn, rusted, or hardly recognizable.

Note: Some skins are "capped," meaning they can not exist in certain conditions (e.g., a skin may only generate up to Minimal Wear).

2. StatTrak™ Technology

Skins with the StatTrak™ prefix function a little, radiant LED counter attached to the weapon body. This counter tracks the precise variety of kills the owner has actually secured with that particular weapon. When equipped by

another player, it temporarily displays an "error" up until returned to the owner. StatTrak skins generally command a higher cost on the market.

3. Memento Packages

During Valve-sponsored Major competitions, viewers enjoying through Steam or partnered streaming platforms can drop Souvenir Packages. Weapons inside these packages include gold stickers celebrating the match, the teams, and the MVP of the round, making them extremely collectible.



Rarity Tiers and Drop Rates

Skins are categorized into unique rarity tiers, which determine how often they appear in weapon cases. The rarity color codes are widely recognized in the video gaming community:

- **Consumer Grade (White):** Common, basic weapon finishes.
- **Industrial Grade (Light Blue):** Slightly superior to customer grade.
- **Mil-Spec (Dark Blue):** Standard low-tier items discovered in cases.
- **Limited (Purple):** Mid-tier items; typically utilized in trade-ups.
- **Categorized (Pink):** Highly sought-after, striking styles.
- **Covert (Red):** The greatest standard weapon tier; extremely uncommon.
- **Rare Special Item (Gold):** Knives and Gloves. The holy grail of unboxing.

How to Acquire CS2 Skins

Players have numerous pathways to build out their dream loadouts, ranging from sheer luck to computed financial transactions.

- **Random Drops:** Simply using official or community servers can net weekly care packages including weapon drops or graffiti.
