4. Significant Tournaments and View Passes

During Valve-sponsored CS2 Major champions, audiences can purchase or often make Souvenir Packages.

- By viewing the tournament live through the Steam TV or in-game client, or by participating in the Pick 'Em Challenge using a Viewer Pass, players can make Souvenir Cases particular to that competition.
- These cases do not need an essential to open, making them 100% free value when obtained.

Alternative Methods: External Sites (Proceed with Caution)
