- Or top class and delicate, like a designer, architect, or expert keep?

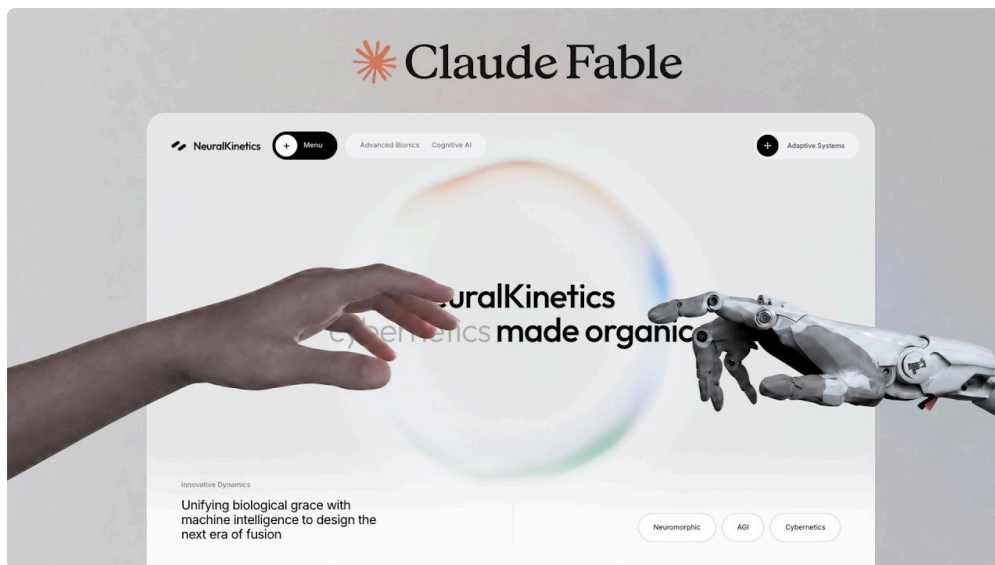
