If a player gets a skin in a trade, they can not trade it again for a full week. This badly interfered with the automated, high-frequency trading bots utilized by CSGO casinos.
- **Account Bans:** Valve routinely bans accounts related to commercial gambling, resulting in millions of dollars worth of skins being locked completely inside prohibited inventories.
