Popular Game Modes in Case Battles

- **Protect Your API Key:** Never log into suspicious phishing sites simulating popular case fight platforms. Constantly double-check URLs.
- **Be careful of Scams:** Be cautious of users in chat spaces offering "totally free earnings" or directing you to unidentified, unverified websites.
