The RNG ensures that outcomes remain random but statistically fair over time, adhering to predetermined Return-to-Player (RTP) percentages licensed by regulators.

- **Boundary 1:** The total number of symbols on reels has a maximum and minimum count.
- **Boundary 2:** Payout tables and odds are pre-defined and transparent, influencing the odds of hitting different combinations.
- **Boundary 3:** Spin results are independent and not influenced by prior outcomes.

So, rather than pure chaos, Megaways mechanics blend procedural generation with controlled randomness.

Chance-Based Outcomes vs Skill-Based Responses

Many new players wonder if strategy or skill can improve their chances in slots, specifically in complex variants like Megaways. 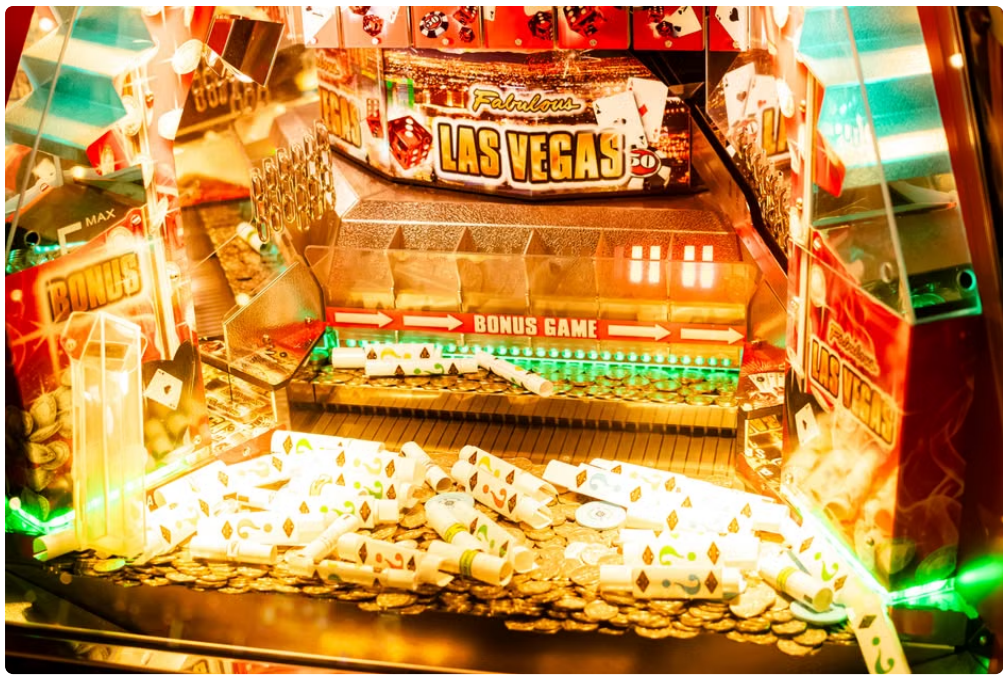

The Price of Megaways Slots
