4. Prize/ Pot Games

- **How it works:** Multiple gamers deposit skins into a cumulative pot. Each skin contributes tickets based on its dollar worth. A random draw picks a winner, where a higher overall contribution yields a higher statistical opportunity of winning the entire pot.
- **Appeal:** The supreme "high-roller" game mode, where single lucky winners can walk away with countless dollars in unusual digital products.
