Coinflip A 1v1 game where 2 gamers wager skins of equal value on a virtual coin toss. Winner takes all (minus a site commission). 50/50 chances, based on a platform rake (cost).

Prize Multiple players contribute skins to a common swimming pool. The greater the value contributed, the higher the opportunity of winning the whole pot. Probability-based based upon relative skin value.
