Undersized systems short-cycle and work harder; oversized units cycle on and off rapidly, waste energy, and degrade faster. Why Does Short Cycling Worsen When Annual Maintenance Is Neglected?

Short cycling—the rapid on-and-off cycling of your compressor—accelerates when maintenance lapses. If your system's tonnage is only slightly higher than your load, a dirty air filter, clogged condenser coils, or low refrigerant from an undetected leak forces the system to work harder just to meet demand. Each cycle puts stress on electrical components and refrigerant circulation. What Role Does Refrigerant Level Play in Meeting Your Load Calculation?

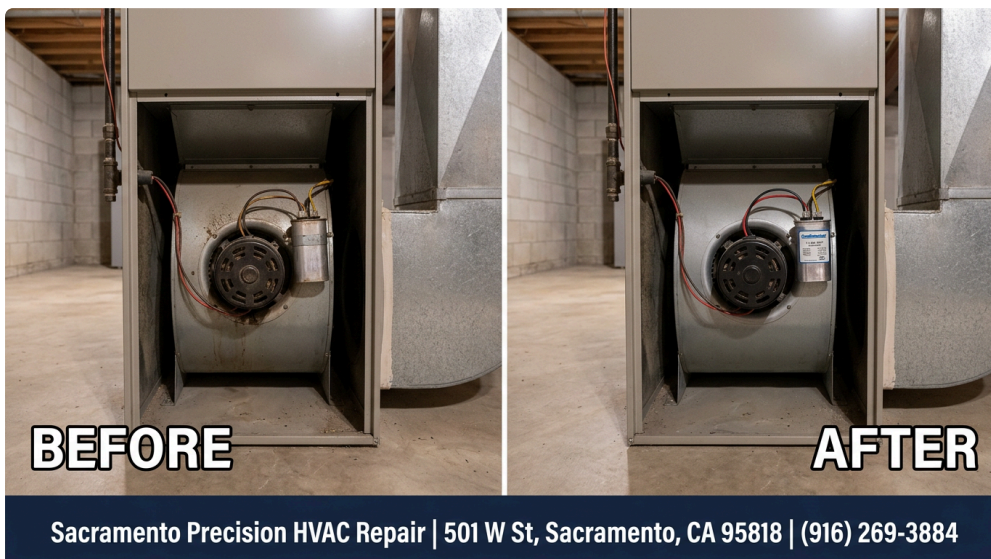
Refrigerant is the fluid that carries heat energy through your system. When a system is sized correctly via Manual J, the refrigerant charge is calibrated to that tonnage and load. If refrigerant leaks—even slowly—your system cannot absorb and reject the BTU load it was designed to handle. In Sacramento's dry heat, evaporator coils lose moisture quickly, and minor leaks go unnoticed for months. A 15-percent refrigerant loss means your 3-ton system performs like a 2.55-ton system, unable to keep up on peak days. Annual maintenance includes checking refrigerant levels and sealing leaks before they degrade performance. Residents in the Natomas area and near Taylor Center rely on our technicians to catch these losses during routine inspections, protecting the tonnage investment they made when their system was installed.

How Do Airflow Restrictions Undermine Your System's Tonnage Rating?

A system's tonnage rating assumes clean coils, unobstructed return air, and properly sized ductwork. When filters are not changed regularly or when condenser coils accumulate dirt and pollen—common in the Central Valley—airflow drops. Restricted airflow forces your compressor to work harder to move the same volume of cool or warm air. If your home's ductwork has leaks (20 to 30 percent of air loss is typical), your system never delivers the full cooling or heating capacity its tonnage should provide. Annual maintenance includes coil cleaning, filter replacement, and duct inspection. Without this upkeep, an already marginal tonnage becomes inadequate.
