Choosing mirror types involves:

1. Determining if task lighting (bright, focused) or ambient lighting (soft, diffused) is priority.
2. Deciding if the LED lights will be front-lit or backlit around the mirror.

3. Confirming electrical provisions: does the new medicine cabinet need a hardwired feed or can it run on plug-in power?

- **Height:** Mount mirror with the bottom edge between 36" and 40" from the floor, varying with user height for comfortable eye level alignment.
- **Clearance:** Allow at least 2-3" clearance between mirror edges and side sconces to prevent glare and crowding.
- **Storage Depth:** Recessed medicine cabinets usually have 3-4" wall depth; ensure walls are prepped to accommodate this without structural changes.

Sconce Spacing and Light Balancing

When using sconces from reputable lines like those by **Golden Lighting**, maintain symmetry by installing them roughly 60-70 inches above the floor and 28-36 inches apart, flanking the mirror evenly. This approach enhances task lighting without shadows on the face.

Always consider light temperature and CRI (Color Rendering Index) — aim for 2700K to 3000K warm white with CRI 90+ to mimic natural skin tones accurately in a bathroom.

Task Lighting vs Ambient Lighting: A Functional Distinction

Designing bathroom lighting often combines two layers:

- **Task lighting:** Very bright, direct illumination at the mirror area for grooming, makeup, and shaving. Hardwired LED medicine cabinet mirrors or paired sconces excel here.
- **Ambient lighting:** Provides overall soft illumination, often from ceiling fixtures, diffused lamps, or backlit mirrors for atmosphere.

I always recommend prioritizing task lighting quality when selecting medicine cabinets with LED features. **Demister yes. Dashboard maybe.** Integrated heated demisters prevent foggy mirrors in steamy bathrooms but are an optional luxury. Similarly, backlit mirrors sold on Lumens often deliver gentle ambient glow that complements, not replaces, task lighting.

When an electrician is involved, they should ensure dedicated feeds for these LEDs for consistent operation and convenience while preventing circuit overload on older bathrooms.

Working with Professionals: Glazier and Electrician Roles

Installation success hinges on the precise collaboration between trades:

- **Glazier:** Templates and installs the plate glass mirror, particularly for frameless or custom-sized cabinet doors. This trade professional ensures edges are sealed properly to prevent water damage and that glass meets humidity resilience standards.
- **Electrician:** Hardwiring LED mirrors, adding new electrical feeds, installing switches, and verifying code compliance. If lighting is wired behind or around the mirror, electrical rough-in must precede mirror hang.

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Professional coordination avoids common pitfalls—like moisture ingress behind cheap mirror frames or improper lighting placement that casts user shadows.
