4. Jackpot/ Pot Games

- **How it works:** Multiple gamers deposit skins into a collective pot. Each skin contributes tickets based upon its dollar worth. A random draw picks a winner, where a higher total contribution yields a greater analytical chance of winning the whole pot.
- **Appeal:** The supreme "high-roller" game mode, where single fortunate winners can walk away with thousands of dollars in uncommon digital products.
