

A dependable garage door keeps safe your vehicle, belongings, and home while providing convenient daily access. In Los Angeles, however, repair needs can vary considerably between neighborhoods, property types, and door designs. A bent or obstructed garage door track can also prevent operation. Look for visible damage, loose fasteners, or a roller sitting outside the track, but avoid forcing the door. An opener is designed to move a properly balanced door; continued operation against resistance can harm the motor and create a greater safety risk.

A noisy garage door may have worn garage door rollers, dry hinges, loose hardware, or a problem with the tracks. Metal rollers and unlubricated hinges can create grinding, squeaking, or rattling sounds. In coastal areas

around Santa Monica, Venice, and Long Beach, salty, humid air can accelerate corrosion on metal hardware, making regular lubrication and corrosion checks especially useful.
