3. The Smoke Grenade Frame Drop & Crash The Symptom

- **: Massive stuttering or an overall crash when multiple dynamic smokes blossom simultaneously.**
- **The Cause:** Because CS2 smokes are volumetric things that communicate with lighting and bullets, they demand substantial GPU compute power and VRAM. Overloaded GPUs might timeout and crash the game.
- **The Fix:** Lower your international shadow quality, particle information, and shader information in the video settings. Guarantee your graphics card's VRAM isn't being totally taken in by background applications.

4. Third-Party Overlay Collisions

- **The Symptom:** Crashing randomly mid-round, often accompanied by a generic "Unhandled Exception" error.
- **The Cause:** Conflicts in between the Source 2 graphics API and overlay software such as Discord, NVIDIA GeForce Experience, RivaTuner Statistics Server (RTSS), or third-party skin trading platforms.
- **The Fix:** Disable overlays one by one to separate the culprit. Disabling the Discord overlay and restricting background recording software often resolves this instantly.
