- **Jackpot:** Multiple gamers throw skins into a single pot. The higher the value of a user's skins relative to the total pot, the higher their statistical chance of winning the whole swimming pool.
- **Esports Betting:** Wagering site credits or skins on professional CS2 matches (such as BLAST, ESL, or Major competitions) based upon real-time chances.
