3. Eliminate the middle screw on the jamb side of the top hinge.
4. Replace the brief screw with a 3-inch wood screw. As you drive it in, it will anchor into the sturdy wall stud behind the door frame, pulling the top of the door back into positioning.

Getting rid of Drafts

Drafty doors waste energy and let in insects.

1. Inspect the door border while closed on a warm day to see where light shines through.
2. Eliminate old, brittle weatherstripping from the door jamb.
3. Tidy the surface area thoroughly.
4. Procedure and cut new V-strip, foam tape, or rubber gasket weatherstripping to fit the leading and sides of the frame.
5. Press or nail the brand-new product firmly into place.
