Categories of Rarity

To comprehend the ecosystem completely, collectors divide uncommon products into unique categories based on their origin and unique qualities.

1 Contraband and Discontinued Items

Valve is typically hands-off with the economy, however exceptions exist. The **M4A4|Shout** is the sole product classified as "Contraband." Following a copyright conflict over the original artwork, Valve changed the design and got rid of the case drop system completely. Anyone holding a Howl kept it, developing a completely capped supply.

Similarly, older operation cases (like the Bravo Case or Huntman Case) no longer drop natively in-game, implying every time one is opened, the general global supply completely reduces.

2. The "Blue Gem" Phenomenon

The *Case Hardened* finish is among the most complex skin key ins Counter-Strike history. It uses a gradient map of blue, purple, and gold that shifts depending upon the weapon's pattern index.

- **The Anomaly:** While many Case Hardened skins feature a mottled mix of colors, incredibly unusual pattern variations cover nearly 100% of the weapon's surface in strong blue.
- **The Pricing:** These "Blue Gems"-- particularly on the Karambit and the AK-47-- command rates that overshadow factory-new knives of higher tier types.

3. Memento Packages from Major Championships

Throughout Valve-sponsored Major competitions, audiences viewing via Steam or connected platforms could randomly receive Souvenir Packages dropped during particular matches.

- These bundles come pre-applied with gold competition stickers commemorating the teams and the MVP of the round.
- The most popular among them are the **Cobblestone Souvenir Packages** signed by legendary gamers like Kenny "kennyS" Schrub, including the sought after AWP|Dragon Lore.

Float worth is a mathematical value in between 0.00 and 1.00 that identifies the wear condition of a skin.

- **Factory New:** 0.00-- 0.07
- **Very little Wear:** 0.07-- 0.15
- **Field-Tested:** 0.15-- 0.38
- **Well-Worn:** 0.38-- 0.45
- **Battle-Scarred:** 0.45-- 1.00. Particular skins are "float topped," suggesting they can not physically drop in Factory New condition, making lower-float Minimal Wear versions extremely important.
