- **NVIDIA Users:** Open GeForce Experience, browse to the **Drivers** tab, and click **Check for Updates**, or download the latest Game Ready Driver straight from the main NVIDIA website.
- **AMD Users:** Open AMD Software: Adrenalin Edition, go to **Settings**, and inspect for software application updates. Carry out a "Clean Install" if recurring crashes persist.

Phase 3: Managing Background Applications and Overlays

Overlays can significantly affect game stability. Gamers need to disable the following functions if they experience frequent crashes:

- Steam Overlay (Disable internationally in Steam Settings > >
- In-Game)Discord Overlay NVIDIA GeForce Experience In-Game Overlay
- Third-party MSI Afterburner or RivaTuner Statistics Server (RTSS) OSD shows

Comparing Crash Types and Solutions

Advanced Solutions for Persistent Crashes

1. Changing Launch Options

Launch choices allow gamers to force the video game to begin under particular specifications, which can bypass initialization bugs.

- Open Steam Library > > Right-click CS: GO > > Properties > General.
- In the **Launch Options** field, try adding:
 - -autoconfig (Resets video and efficiency settings to default)
 - -nod3d9ex (Disables an older DirectX extension that sometimes triggers conflicts)
 - -threads [number] (Forces the video game to use a particular number of CPU cores)

2. Keeping An Eye On Hardware Temperatures and Overclocks

Pushing hardware beyond factory limitations by means of overclocking (CPU, GPU, or RAM) can cause instability in demanding source-engine games.

- Usage tracking software application like HWMonitor or MSI Afterburner to examine temperature levels while playing.
- If temperatures surpass 85 ° C, tidy out dust filters and guarantee appropriate air flow.
- Momentarily go back any factory overclocks or XMP profiles to test if system stability improves.

3. Re-installing Visual C++ and DirectX

Many video game crashes occur due to the fact that the Windows operating system does not have the essential runtime libraries required to carry out game scripts.

- Browse to the video game's setup folder: Steam \ steamapps \ common \ Counter-Strike Global Offensive \ _CommonRedist
- Run the installers situated inside the vcredist and DirectX folders to repair or update vital system files.

Preventative Measures for a Stable Gaming Experience

Preventing future crashes is typically easier than identifying them after the truth. Embracing a few regular upkeep practices can keep a gaming rig running smoothly:

- **Keep Windows Updated:** Ensure the os has the most recent cumulative security and performance updates set up.

- **Carry Out Clean Driver Installations:** When carrying out major GPU motorist updates, use a tool like Display Driver Uninstaller (DDU) in Safe Mode to wipe old motorist remnants totally before setting up the brand-new variation.
