

A Long Island neighborhood that wears the weather

North Bellmore does not have the kind of scenery people usually picture when they think of a destination, but that is part of its appeal. It is a working, lived-in suburban community, shaped by postwar homebuilding, family routines, commuter patterns, and the kind of everyday maintenance that keeps a neighborhood looking cared for.
