Factory New (FN)	0.00-- 0.07	Pristine, flawless surface with very little to no scratches.
Minimal Wear (MW)	0.07-- 0.15	Really light wear, typically a couple of minor scuffs on close inspection.
Field-Tested (FEET)	0.15-- 0.38	Visible scratches and endure popular edges and paint.
Well-Worn (WW)	0.38-- 0.45	Substantial wear, paint fading, and visible scratches throughout the body.
Battle-Scarred (BS)	0.45-- 1.00	Heavily distressed, rusted, or peeling paint. (Some skins look remarkably cool in this condition!)
