Frequent Garage Door Problems in Southern California

Garage door problems often develop with ordinary wear and tear rather than one major failure. A garage door spring can lose strength, a garage door panel can become dented, or a garage door opener can lose power. The garage door track may also bend or collect dirt, preventing smooth movement.

Weather, age, vehicle impact, and poor previous adjustments can all lead to problems. A professional should inspect the entire system instead [Garage Door Installation](#) of replacing one obvious part without checking the springs, cables, rollers, tracks, opener, hinges, and safety equipment.

Broken Springs, Cables, and Rollers

Keep remotes out of children's reach and teach family members to watch the door until it is fully closed. Do not disable a safety sensor or automatic reversal feature to solve a nuisance problem. If the door reverses unexpectedly, closes unevenly, or makes a sharp noise, arrange a garage door safety inspection.

Never attempt to unwind a torsion spring, stretch an extension spring, remove a cable, or lift a very heavy door after a spring failure. These components can cause serious injuries when handled incorrectly.
