- **Trade Hold Penalties:** To curb instant skin trading used by gambling websites, Valve introduced a seven-day trade hang on any item traded between accounts. This considerably disrupted the instant-deposit design.
- **Continuous Enforcement:** Valve frequently bans bots associated with recognized gambling platforms, leading to the confiscation of countless dollars in virtual products held by those bots.

Despite these procedures, the industry has adjusted by making use of cryptocurrency deposits, peer-to-peer trading systems, and moving domains to bypass blocks.
