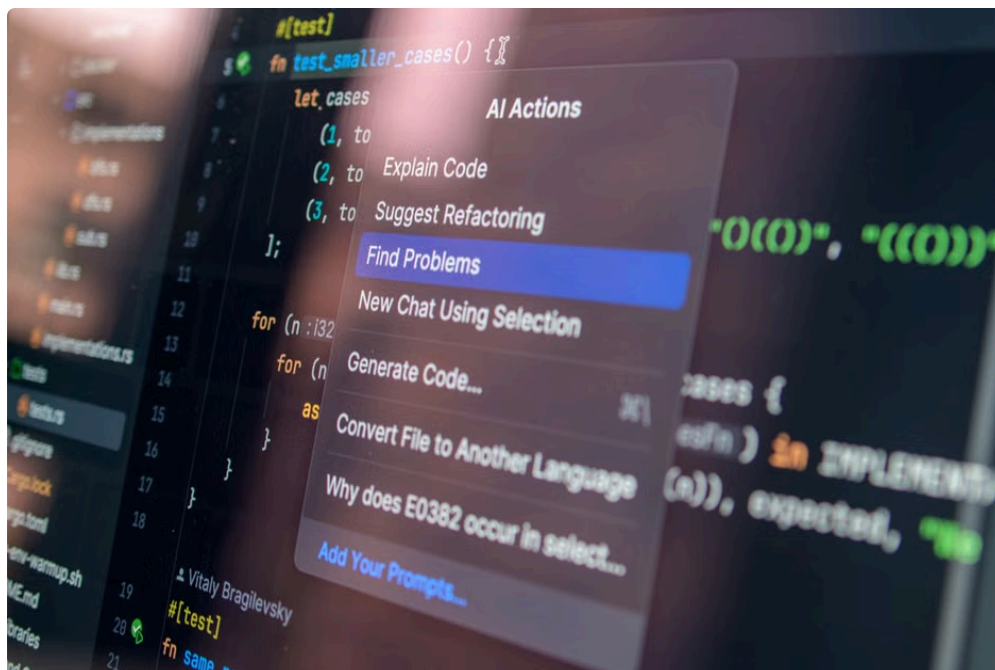


Five Models at Work: Suprmind's Architecture
