What Makes My Garage Door So Loud?

If any part is dirty, slack, degraded, warped, or improperly adjusted, the entire system may become noisier.



Garage door rollers are a frequent source of noise. Steel rollers can become rusty or develop worn bearings, while inexpensive rollers may become rough after years of use. Nylon rollers are generally less noisy, but they can also crack or wear. Garage door hinges may creak when they lack lubrication or vibrate when their fasteners loosen. A rattling noise commonly indicates loose hardware, including bolts, nuts, brackets, or opener mounting components. A vibrating garage door panel can also create a rattle, particularly if a panel has been warped or a brace has loosened. A popping sound may occur when a spring, cable, or roller shifts under load. Because those parts can store substantial energy, popping should not be ignored.

Damaged rollers may cause a rhythmic ticking, rumbling, or grinding sound that speeds up as the door moves. Listening to whether the noise comes from the top, sides, or center of the door can support a noisy garage door diagnosis, but homeowners should avoid placing hands near moving components.
