4. Jackpot/ Pot Games

- **How it works:** Multiple gamers deposit skins into a cumulative pot. Each skin contributes tickets based on its dollar value. A random draw picks a winner, where a higher overall contribution yields a higher statistical possibility of winning the whole pot.
- **Appeal:** The ultimate "high-roller" video game mode, where single fortunate winners can leave with countless dollars in uncommon digital products.
