- **Prize:** Multiple gamers toss skins into a shared pot. The overall value determines each player's percentage opportunity of winning. A spinner chooses one lucky winner to take everything.
- **Esports Betting:** Traditional sportsbooks incorporated into skin sites, permitting users to wager skins or money on professional CS2 matches (e.g., ESL Pro League, Majors).
