

What Can Garage Door Repair Typically Involve?

Garage door repair can require much more than replacing a worn part. A technician may check the entire **overhead garage door**, determine the cause of the problem, and test the door after completing the work. Common services include fixing or replacing springs, cables, rollers, hinges, tracks, brackets, weather seals, and other **garage door hardware**.
