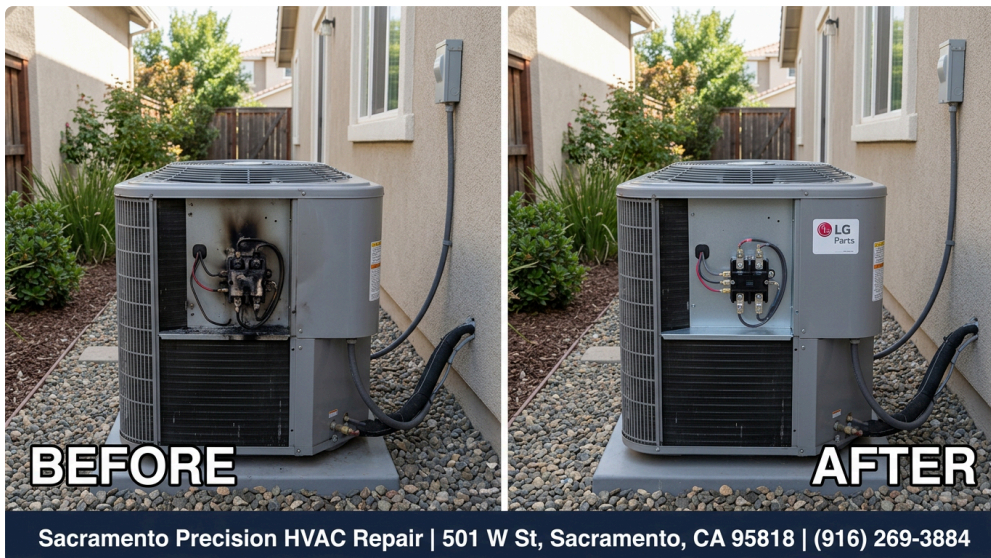
How Does Furnace Age Affect the Replacement Cost Range for Homes Your Size?
